Even thriller writers like to take a break with TV every now and then. These are a few of our recent favorites from across the pond.

BROADCHURCH (streaming on Netflix in the US).

This series is outstanding. David Tennant is a stunner, as always, along with Brit TV veteran Olivia Colman. When a young boy dies, two detectives are thrust into a complex murder investigation—and their sleepy seaside town jumps into the national spotlight. New to the town, DI Hardy (Tennant) forces his partner DI Miller (Colman) to look a deeper look at everyone she knows—or thought she knew.

THE NIGHT MANAGER (streaming on Amazon in the US).

This John le Carré adaptation tells of a soldier-turned-hotel-manager who infiltrates an international arms ring at the request of MI5, and it's just brilliant – and superbly cast with Tom Hiddleston pitted against Hugh Laurie (!). Put me in the "Tom Hiddleston for the next James Bond" camp because he is dashing, charming, and all kinds of badass in this series. Also included: Olivia Colman! (she turns up a lot these days – she's even going to replace Claire Foy as Queen Elizabeth II in *The Crown* next season)

COLLATERAL. (streaming on Netflix in the US).

The Kerr highly recommends this new BBC mini-series. COLLATERAL stars Carey Mulligan as a green-but-tough DI who investigates the murder of a pizza deliveryman in south London. But all is not as it seems. The murder is too clean, too professional to be coincidence. Why kill a pizza deliveryman? And was the shooter... female? Something much more sinister is at play...







Um, hello, I want that mayo!


